

# What to Bring to a CHILD DEVELOPMENT Screening

A little preparation can go a long way in helping your child feel comfortable and making your visit as helpful as possible. Here are a few things to bring with you.

**1 Useful Documentation**  
If you have them, bring any previous evaluation reports, medical records (such as vaccinations, injuries, or hospital visits), and school or child care notes. These give the screening team a broader picture of your child.

**2 Your Own Observations**  
You know your child best. Jot down anything you've noticed about their development—speech, movement, social interactions, or emotions.

**3 Glasses, Hearing Devices, or Medications**  
If your child uses any assistive devices or takes medication, please bring these to the appointment.

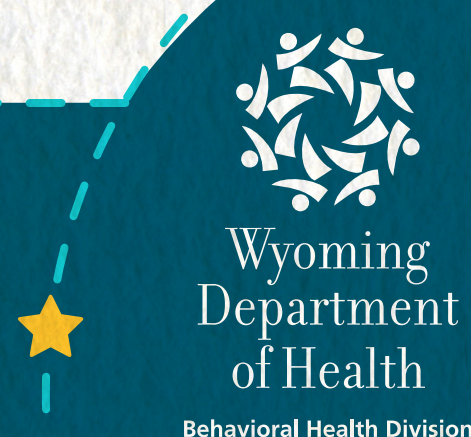
**4 Questions or Concerns**  
It's easy to forget things in the moment, so bring a list of questions or anything on your mind. No concern is too small.

**5 Comfort Items**  
A favorite toy, book, or snack can help your child feel more relaxed and at ease during the screening.
